General Rules

- Number of Players:** Maximum of 9 players per team on field at any time and minimum of 7 to start a game. Substitutions may occur on an unlimited basis and must be from your team's roster. (Exception: Teams can pick up only one player from another current season team to sub in order to avoid a forfeit). Play will be stopped by the official to allow substitutions after a goal, an injury, or a yellow card.
- Player Equipment:** Consists of shirt, shorts, sweats, socks, shin guards, and shoes. Goalkeeper must wear colors that will distinguish him/her from all other players and referee. No metal cleats will be allowed for player safety. Shin guards are mandatory for all players. **Knee braces with exposed metal must be wrapped or covered.** Watches, rings, looped earrings, or necklaces must be removed or wrapped with tape.
- Referees:** One center referee on the field, responsible for control of the game. Referees are scheduled by the Recreation Division.
- Game:** Two, **35 minute halves** with 5 minute half-time. The clock will run continuously. If the league game ends in a tie, it remains a tie.
- Ball out of Play:** The ball is out of play when it passes behind the net, when the whole ball passes completely over the sideline, or when a goal is scored. The ball is in play at all other times, even if it rebounds off the referee, goalpost, etc.
- Start of Play:** By coin flip, and then alternate at half.
- Method of Scoring:** A goal is scored when the whole of the ball passes completely over the goal line.
- Off side Violation:** The outdoor offside rule will apply.
- Fouls and Misconduct:** A player who intentionally kicks, trips, strikes, jumps at, pushes, holds, violently charges, or charges in the back of an opponent, or who intentionally handles the ball (except the goal-keeper), shall be penalized by a direct free kick. A player guilty of a second offense in any game shall receive a mandatory caution. The third such penalty shall result in a mandatory ejection. ***If any player or spectator is guilty of misconduct, rude conduct, or conduct likely to bring the game into dispute, he/she or the captain shall be issued a caution (yellow card). If a player is guilty of violent conduct (or serious foul play) he/she shall be ejected (red card) permanently and must retire from the game and leave the field.***
- Delay of Game Penalty:** If the goalkeeper delays action by holding the ball for more than five seconds; if a defender passes back to the goalkeeper from another zone and the goalkeeper plays the ball with her HANDS, then an indirect free kick is awarded to the opposing team.
- Free Kicks:** Classified into two categories – direct, from which a goal can be scored directly against the offending team, and indirect, from which a goal cannot be scored unless the ball has been touched by a second player before entering the goal.
- Penalty Kicks:** Awarded for offenses committed by defenders against an attacker in the penalty area. The kick is taken from the penalty spot by any player on the offended team. The goal keeper must stand on the goal line and between the posts. All players except the kicker and goalkeeper must be outside the penalty area. The ball is in play as soon as it is kicked forward one-half rotation.
- Goal Kick:** When the ball completely passes behind the goal after being last touched by a player from the attacking team, it is put back into play by a kick from the goal area by the defending team.
- Corner Kick:** When the ball completely passes behind the goal after being last touched by a player from the defending team, it is put back into play by a kick from the corner spot on the side of the field the ball had left. The corner kick is a direct free kick for the attacking team.
- Team Rosters:** Must be signed by all players. Players must be ***at least 18 years or older to participate*** in this league. NO additions to the roster can be done after the third week of play except for one of these three circumstances: 1) A player leaves town on short notice (new job, family crisis, etc.); 2) injuries; 3) other hardships as granted by the league coordinator.
- Substitutes may enter a game at intervals allowed by the official. Teams can pick up only one additional sub from another team if they are on a current city league roster in order to avoid forfeit.
- The number of players a team may carry on their roster is not limited. All players must sign roster for liability reasons by the third week of play.
- Teams must have matching shirts. Please indicate which shirt color at the time of registration. Teams listed first on the schedule will have color preference in the case of two teams wearing the same color shirts. The opposing team must have players wear a different color shirt or use the game pinnies provided by BPRPL.
- Protests involving official's decisions should be in writing, delivered to the City Rec. office within one working day after the game in question.
- Slide tackles are not allowed in this recreational league.
- Players who bring children to the facility must have them supervised by a responsible adult at all times.
- Please remember:** NO alcohol, glass bottles, tobacco, or dogs at the facility. Pick up your own trash.
- Rules not specifically address above will be in accordance with the F.I.F.A. rules.
